WEEK 1 (July 9 to 13) Trashion for Kids (FULL DAY only)




Students will design and construct wearable art from discarded and recycled items with the talented painter and **Trashique®** artist **Leslie Batty**. Their creations can be their next Halloween costume! They will script and develop a performance piece for the final day of the workship. WEEK 2 (July 16 to 20) Mural Making Workshop - Art Brigade @FAM (FULL DAY only)

For the third year, **Erik Gonzalez**, muralist, graffiti artist, educator, and founder of the Urbanists Collective in Visalia, returns for another fun and inspiring workshop! Students will create a an outdoor mural on a cube in the Museum's Sculpture Garden. Participating students will explore original art works, contribute to the design, and help paint the mural with Erik's guidance. Note that students will use traditional brush-work and be trained on the proper use of spray paint in creating the mural. Students will explore a variety of media in creating sculpture with clay, plaster, wire, and other materials. Students will also be using painting techniques to apply color to their works.

Art in 3-D: Exploring Fiber (PM)

Taking inspiration from Kay Sekimachi and Jenne Giles (two exhibitions opening in the summer), students will create sculptural works with fiber, paper, and other found and natural elements.
